The Board of Directors of the St. Lawrence Neighbourhood Association is pleased to provide this background in support of the proposed joint community project between SLNA and Jamii.

The Project

The St. Lawrence Neighbourhood Association (SLNA) has partnered with Jamii Esplanade to create a mural for the exterior wall of the St. Lawrence Community Recreation Centre at 230 The Esplanade. The mural will serve as a legacy feature and celebratory landmark honouring the SLNA's 40 years of service to the residents of the St. Lawrence Neighbourhood. It will be painted by Indigenous artist Darwin Peters of the Pikangikum First Nation.

SLNA's relationship with JAMII

For thirteen years, Jamii has made good use of our public spaces to provide culturally and socially engaging programs and events for residents of all ages in the St. Lawrence neighbourhood in Toronto's downtown east. The SLNA has partnered with Jamii on a number of its signature projects through the years, including "Celebrating Community" on July1, 2021. The SLNA has also supported Jamii's local artistic presentations and performances, including the production of "The Wedding" in 2021, and a distinctive series of workshops and activities for seniors in 2022. The SLNA is very proud to be one of Jamii's partners for "The Esplanade Hub" – established in 2023 as a dynamic and creative space for the Community on the Esplanade.

Through artistic presentations and community-engaged projects that reach thousands every year, Jamii engages and reflects the multifaceted and multicultural nature of the St. Lawrence neighbourhood. The organization's programming – performances, workshops and interactive sessions – attracts the participation of all elements of the community – seniors, children and their families, youth of all ages and young adults.

Our relationship with Jamii as a community partner is a long standing and productive one.
