



Community Meeting Minutes
October 25, 2017

1. Suzanne Kavanagh, chaired for the evening welcomed all and introductions were made.

4. Ben Mills from Public Art Management gave a presentation and answered questions on how a developer and the city work together to create public art in public spaces. He talked about works in our area such as the "brickman" on Jarvis and Adelaide and the stamp commemoration on Adelaide and George as a tribute to the post office on Adelaide. He talked about the importance of retaining Canadian artists knowing that in the future their installations will increase in value. Also mentioned was the work at 88 Scott which will soon be open the public. He advised that developers pay a certain portion toward public art and that at times there may be a piece on site or the developers pays cash in lieu which then goes into the "pot" for future projects. Finally, he mentioned that the Backstage will be getting an installation either this fall or early spring, weather permitting. This art piece is by an up and coming Indigenous artist.
