

Delegates Meeting - February 22, 2017 MINUTES 7:00 p.m. - 9:00 p.m. 115 The Esplanade, O.W.N.

- 1. Welcome and Introductions. A quorum existed. The meeting was called to order.
- 2. Approval of Agenda as amended. Moved by Sherri Russell, Seconded by Cherril Baker. Carried Other Business added: Toronto Hydro, Toronto's First Post Office, Construction, and Seniors Programming Committee.
- 3. Approval of January 25th Minutes as amended. Moved by Toby Tenenbaum, Seconded by Cherril Baker. Carried. Page 1 3.2. Should read 53 Ontario Street, Page 2 7.7 Should read funding for replacement of Victorian style light standards.
- 4. Board Update. Debra Corey reviewed the list of buildings that have yet to renew. Suggested that delegates see Debra at end of meeting to connect on membership. If your building/housing group is not paid then you will not be able to vote at AGM nor can you run for a board position. Suzanne advised that there are five positions for the board this year, two-one year terms, two threeyear terms and one two year term. Currently we have received two nominations. If you want your name of the ballot nominations must be in by Monday March 27th. Otherwise nominations will be opened on the floor at the AGM March 29th. Suzanne also advised that Environment Day will be May 6th and the board is working with the BIA and the Market on programing that day which will include free box lunches for people picking up yard waste. - 6. Councillor's Office Update. Tom Davidson advised that Budget meeting was held at Regent Park and the Councillor spoke about capitol projects in Ward 28. David Crombie Park will start the process for refurbishment. North Market archaeological dig will be wrapping up and contraction for North Market will commence. Completion is scheduled for 2019. Berczy Park will have an official opening in the spring and programming will begin. Tree planting will continue along Wellington on north side of park. St. James Park will start refurbishment work this summer and SLNA will host Canada Day at the Park. Wellington Street Streetscape work will begin this spring.
- 7. King Street Corridor by David Hunter from the City of Toronto. A link will be sent to Delegates after the meeting to complete survey. David walked through the need for the street and that transit is first.
