- Development Committee met recently with 75 The Esplanade, a letter is going to the City advising that there is too much height, buildings need to scale down as they step away from Yonge Street. Also more attention needs to be paid along Church Street for more streetscape and public realm. Update on the Sobey's/Acura site: The committee struck a working group with the developer and have met several times over the summer. The community wants to ensure we have a better development than what was originally proposed and that at the OMB pre conference hearing October 14 we can avert a full blown hearing February 1.

The BIA is finishing up another great season of Music and Movies in St. James Park.

- Thursday August 27th, we present our final concert with Up Jumped Swing featuring Miz Debbie. This 8 piece ensemble play New Orleans style dance music, jazz, swing and blues and the concert will be preceded by a half hour swing dance lesson at 6:30 p.m. at the gazebo. It will be a fun night!
- Our season of programming in St. James Park featured 9 concerts, 3 days of NXNE concerts and 3 movies.

Bard in Berczy. Shakespeare's Love's Labour's Lost

• Performed on Friday and Saturday evenings and Saturday and Sunday matinees from July 24th – August 16th. Audience surveys showed a good mix of residents, theatre lovers and out of towners. The style of the urban performance allows for accessibility for the die-hard theatre fan as well as the novice.

Celebrate contemporary design with KEDD's Life.Style.Fair.

- On September 26th, from 10:00am 5:00pm, Toronto's largest public festival celebrating contemporary design will once again showcase a harmony of art and design around the King East Design District (KEDD) presented by the St. Lawrence Market Neighbourhood BIA and Old Town Toronto with proceeds benefiting Habitat for Humanity Greater Toronto area.
- Installations curated by top local designers and artists using products from local design showrooms, along with one-of-a-kind designed food kiosks, will span the neighborhood, transforming King Street from Church to Parliament and surrounding areas. This year, we will be constructing a stud of a house in a parking lot on the north side of King Street between Princess and Ontario Streets. The public can make a donation and sign the studs, which will be used in a future build. From the anticipated public art project led by George Brown College School of Design students on Frederick Street to the showroom installations curated specifically for this festival, the visual vibrancy of the neighbourhood will set the stage for inspiration.

The BIA's annual Pumpkin Parade in St. James Park will be held on Sunday, November 1st from 6 – 7:30 p.m.

• The BIA will be working with the children at St. Michael's Catholic School and the Downtown Alternative School as well as the families in the St. Lawrence Market Neighbourhood to carve pumpkins provided by the BIA and bring them to St. James Park to compete for the prize of best pumpkin design. Businesses in the area will compete for best design by a BIA member. Last year's winner was *Triple A* bar and their winning design will be featured on our transit shelter ad campaign for this year's event.

• This year, the event will be in St. James Park (while Berczy is under construction). Date and time to be confirmed but we will have our Victorian carollers and free hot beverages to get everyone in the holiday spirit.
